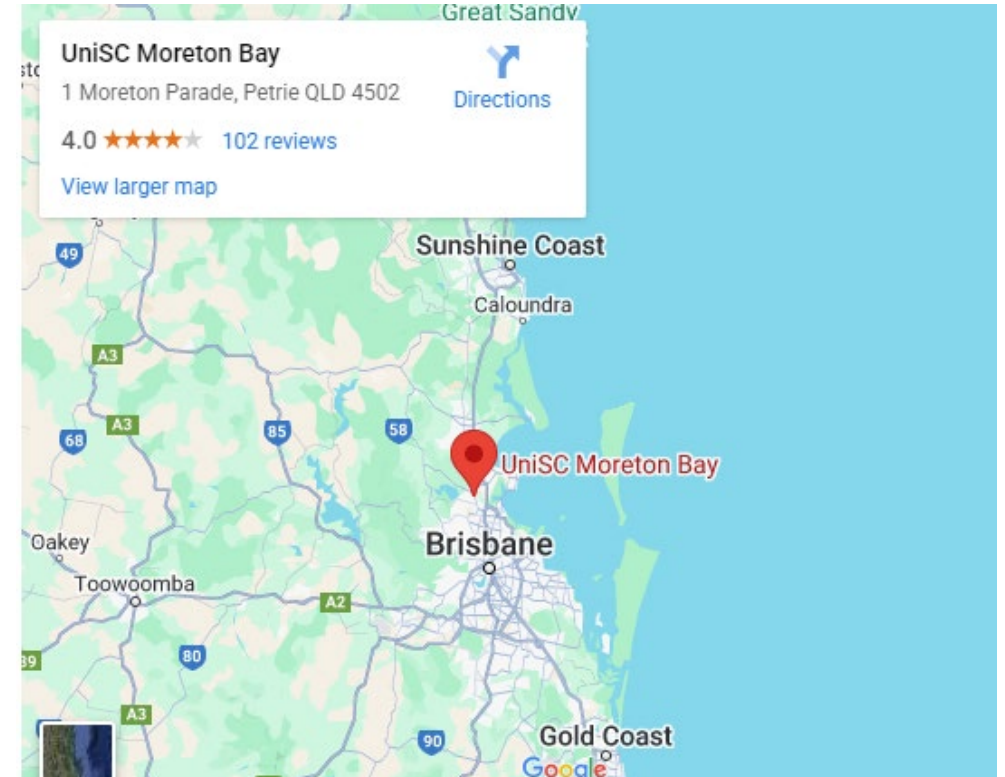
Welcome to UniSC!

- UniSC is a young, community focused university founded in 1996.
- A member of the Regional Universities Network (RUN), UniSC has Queensland campuses stretching from Hervey Bay in the north to Moreton Bay in the south.
- UniSC is the world's only university with campuses on three connecting UNESCO biosphere reserves.
- We are delighted to welcome you to Queensland's newest university campus at Moreton Bay and the first DiGRAA to be held outside of a capital city.



Location

- DiGRAA 2026 will be hosted at UniSC Moreton Bay in Petrie, the City of Moreton Bay, QLD on February 9, 10 and 11.
- We recommend interstate delegates fly into Brisbane airport.
- There is a [train](#) from Brisbane Airport to Brisbane Central station via Fortitude Valley .
- You can also book airport transfers with [Conxion](#).
- We strongly recommend all delegates arrive by train to the conference venue each day as UniSC Moreton Bay is a very short walk from Petrie Station.



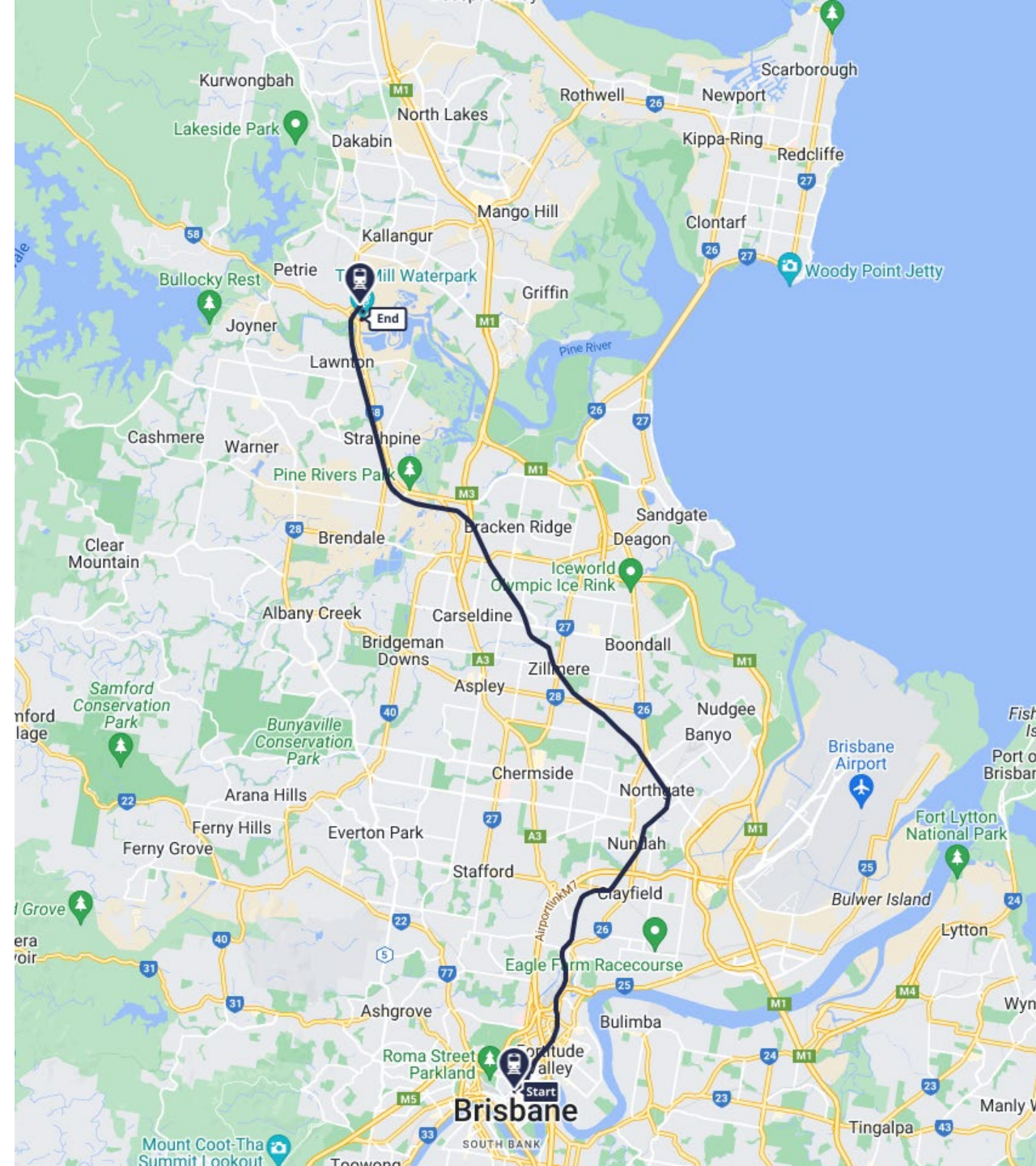
Where to Stay in Moreton Bay


- We strongly recommend delegates stay on the train lines to UniSC Moreton Bay. There is virtually no accommodation in Petrie.
- The Brisbane CBD near Central Station and Fortitude Valley would likely be the most convenient locations.
- For those who want to stay near the beach, we suggest Redcliffe and the surrounds.




Getting to UniSC Moreton Bay

- Petrie Station is a 29-minute journey from Brisbane Central Station (pictured) and a 27-minute journey from Fortitude Valley Station on the Caboolture and Springfield/Redcliffe Peninsula Lines.
- If staying in Redcliffe, there is a bus, or you could make your way to Kippa-Ring station via bus or Uber and take the train from there to Petrie Station. Kippa-Ring Station to Petrie Station is a 16-minute journey on the Springfield/Redcliffe Peninsula Lines.
- You can use [Translink's Journey Planner](#) or Google Maps to plan your route.
- Public transport is currently 50 cents per ride in Queensland.
- You can use your contactless Visa, Mastercard and American Express debit or credit cards, including those in a digital wallet, [to pay](#) for trains and buses in Brisbane and Moreton Bay.





Double check the train timetables and arrive on time as there could be a 15 or 20-minute wait between trains during peak hour. Outside of peak hour, there might be a 1 hour wait.

Arriving at UniSC Moreton Bay

- Once you leave Petrie Station head across the road, turn right and then turn left into Bribie Circuit.
- Cross the grassy area and head to the largest building: our A1 Foundational Building. The conference will be hosted in the Auditorium.

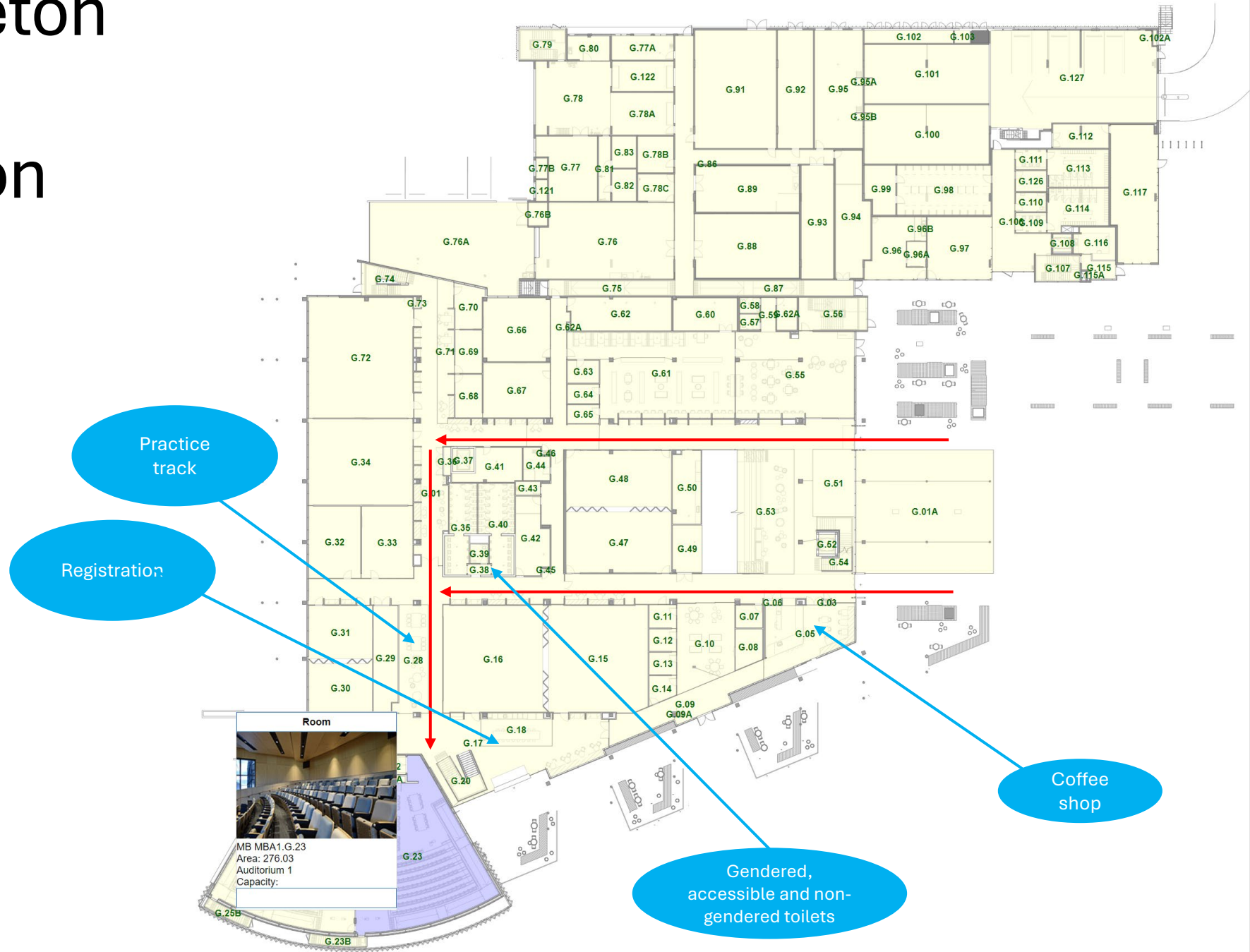

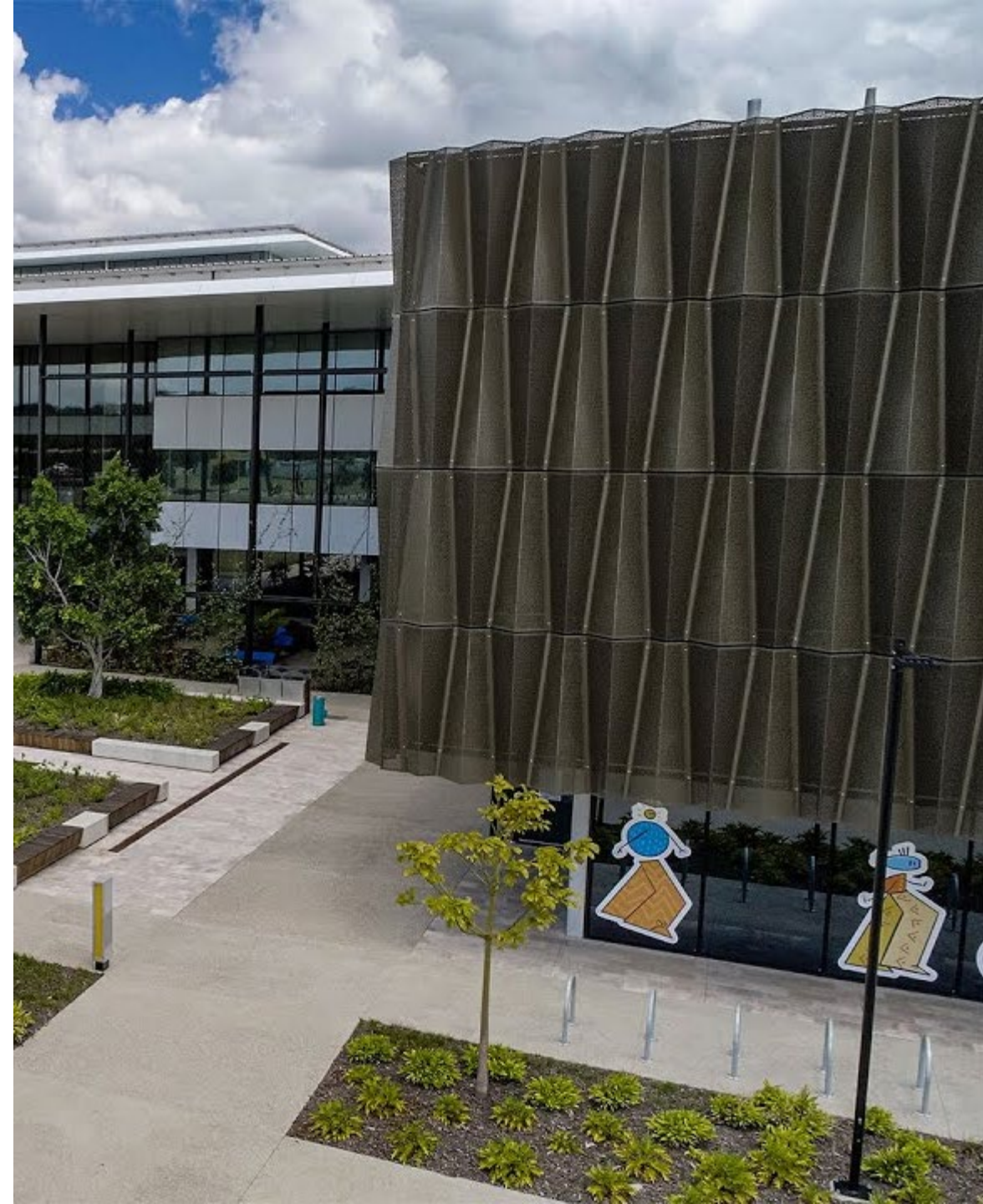
UniSC Moreton Bay A1 Foundation Building

- Once inside, follow the path indicated by the red arrows to the Auditorium. Registration will be outside.
- Ignore any stairs and elevators! The conference is in the Auditorium: G.23 on the ground floor. Registration will be outside.
- Look out for the coffee shop to the left when you enter.
- We will have volunteers around if you get lost.



Amenities

- There are male, female, accessible and gender-neutral bathrooms close to the conference room.
- If you would like to access a quiet room, please see a member of the organising committee and we will be able to help you.
- Conference dedicated wi-fi should be available along with eduroam.



Food

- Morning tea and afternoon tea will be provided each day.
- Delegates can pre-order lunch in the registration form. Please read the instructions carefully and note the hard deadlines.
- [The campus café](#) might be very busy during the conference and additional lunch options are a 15-minute walk.



Presenter Information

- If your submission is accepted, both extended abstract and practice track live presenters will need to prepare and submit their slides in advance of the conference.
- When presenting on the day, presenters will not be able to attach a laptop or use presenter mode. Please prepare accordingly.
- Online presenters will record their presentation and submit the recording in advance.
- All presenters, in-person and online, are expected to be present in their session for a live Q&A.
- Extended abstract presentations will be 15 minutes long. Practice track lightning talks will be 5 minutes long.





Practice Track Information

- Successful practice track presenters will need to supply all of their own equipment, computers and so on.
- The conference organisers take no responsibility for equipment or belongings that are left unattended by the owner.
- The practice track will be officially open during lunch each day of the conference.
